Financial Institution Intern (Pathways Program)





Program Overview

Provides high-performing college students with valuable professional experience in the financial regulatory industry. Participants will gain hands-on experience evaluating bank operations, risk management strategies, and consumer protection practices. Interns will learn in-depth banking laws and regulatory procedures while working with experienced FDIC professionals to ensure institutions are following safe and sound banking practices. In this unique program, participants will have an opportunity to participate in on-site bank examinations. This requires teamoriented individuals with strong analytical and quantitative skills who possess the ability to effectively communicate both orally and in writing.

Employment is primarily during summer and other school breaks - works with your school schedule.

Significant overnight travel and independent transportation is required. Travel to banks is paid by FDIC and may include reimbursement for food, mileage, and hotel lodging.

Upon successful completion of the program, at least 640 hours of work experience in the intern program, and a skills assessment, some participants may be offered a full-time (post-graduation) position as a Financial Institution Specialist at the Field Office where the internship was completed. Note: conversion to a permanent position is not guaranteed.

Outstanding Pay

A starting salary of \$41,654 to \$57,327 per annum. Salary earned will be based on actual time worked. Per hour salary is \$19.96-\$27.47 depending on location. A \$2,500, one-time stipend is provided.

Basic Program Requirements (Refer to Posting for Details)

- Must be a U.S. Citizen.
- Must be seeking a degree at an accredited college/university with a MAJOR in accounting, banking, business
 administration, commercial or banking law, economics, finance, mathematics, statistics, marketing, or other fields
 related to the position.
- Must have at least a cumulative (overall) 3.0 GPA.
- Must have completed two full academic years (Sophomores and Juniors) towards the degree.
- Must have completed 3 semester hours in accounting.
